3.	<u>Feedback from IEA Conference in Florence, Italy (Sue Alexander)</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Patient safety had high profile – focus on quality to prevent medical misadventures. Useful information includes using Systems Engineering Initiatives for Patient Safety (SEIPS); complexity theory (refer White Paper on Complexity Science in Healthcare by Jeffrey Braithwaite); WHO new publication Delivering Quality Health Services: an imperative for Universal Health Coverage; ISQua information about SAFE Programme (Situation Awareness for Everyone). • Healthcare streams covered a variety of topics e.g. linking patient unsteadiness and need for assistance with carer discomfort; barriers for caring for people in their own home; role conflict and ambiguity for informal carers; Ergo Patient Handling Card – Finland; forces required when using slide sheet; sit-stand devices; preference of ceiling lifts over floor lifts; association between number of handling episodes per shift with discomfort. • UK White Paper Human Factors for Health and Social Care (launched by CIEHF) early October 2018 to promote an integrated system-wide approach. • Barriers and Facilitators for implementing NZMHP guidelines – paper by Hannele Lahti from Massey University.
